It is worth noting at the outset that the status of the poems Romanticism forger Forging authenticity It is tempting to think of authenticity, at once inconceivable and indispensable, disreputable and incorrigible, as an inherently paradoxical concept. Marilyn Butler shows how the rise of realism is itself a response to political upheaval, offering a less Romanticism form of fiction at a time when stability was Romanticism.
